The ACP Legal Association, over which I have the honour of presiding, is delighted to invite you to the OHADAC Convention, which will take place on September 21-22 2015 at the World Trade Centre Complex in GUADELOUPE (FWI). This Convention will be an opportunity for us to formally present all of the work carried out so far and to announce the launch of the first OHADAC institution, “The OHADAC Centre for Arbitration and Conciliation”, whose headquarters will be located in Guadeloupe.

Works presented at the Convention will be centred on the OHADAC Principles for International Commerce Contracts, OHADAC Arbitration and Conciliation, the OHADAC Model Law of Private International Law and the OHADAC Model Law of Commercial Companies. We would be extremely honoured if you were able to attend and take part in the debates and presentations held at this historic convention, which will help create the foundations for the genuine regional integration of Caribbean countries and territories.
